POLLY INFORMATION SHEET



FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY WEAR YOUR LIFE JACKET AT ALL TIMES WHEN ON POLLY DUTY.

Polly duty is normally confined to the hours between 07.30 and 19.30 hours.

The duty runs 3 hours either side of high tide - this may be split into two stints where there is an early and late high tide, but is still normally between 07.30 and 19.30 hours and within 3 hours of high tide.

The prevailing weather conditions and safety must be at your discretion. If choppy, consider recruiting a bow-person.

- 1) PLACE ISOLATOR KEY INTO POSITION ON PORT PANEL TURN ON SET THROTTLE TO FULLY OPEN IN NEUTRAL POSITION (press centre button in when shifting throttle).
- 2) PRESS PREHEAT FOR 30 SECONDS AND PRESS BUTTON FOR START
- 3) CHECK EXHAUST HAS WATER, & FORWARD & REVERSE WORK BEFORE SLIPPING THE MOORING

AT THE END OF THE DAY

- 1. MOOR WITH TWO PENNANTS & CHECK FOR CHAFE
- 2. SET BATTERY TO POSITION 2 (PARK BILGE PUMP)
- 3. ENSURE FLAP IS OVER ISOLATOR SWITCH
- 4. ENSURE STAINLESS STEEL PLATE IS OVER CONTROL PANEL
- 5. PLEASE REPORT BACK ANY MECHANICAL PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED

CONTINUOUS BUZZING

The Oil Level/Pressure alarm sometimes sticks on, buzzing continuously. Put engine in neutral (press centre button in when shifting throttle) and rev hard briefly. It generally goes off; if not, check oil level.
