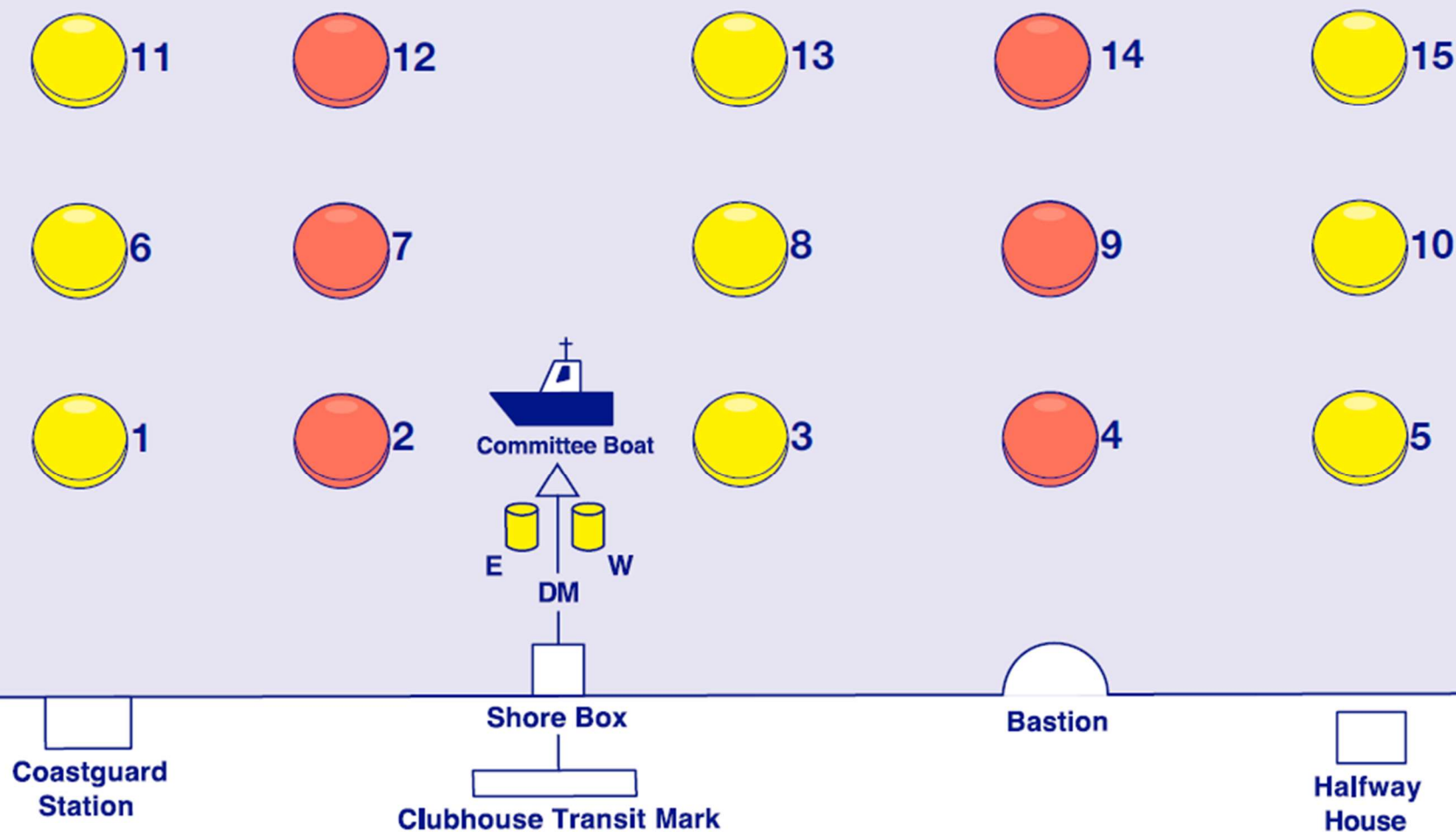

Race Duties

What are Race Duties?

Race duties are needed to manage the club racing and to provide safety support boat cover. These are managed on **Dutyman**, an online tool – see the link on the TBYC website to access. All club members who race or sail, and benefit from the support are expected to take their turn doing duties and all members (except Lunchtime Members) of TBYC can get involved by volunteering.

Currently around 200 members undertake 800 or so duties each year. The majority do 3 or 4 duties per year but some volunteer to do many more.

Duties are for Race Officer, Assistant Race Officer and the helm and crew of the support boats plus RIB launch using the clubs tow car.

A Duty Officer is allocated for each race day and is usually a member of the Sailing Committee or an experienced volunteer.

Duty man and the Duty Roster

Dutyman is the tool used by TBYC to allocate and manage race duties and has been in use for over 10 years at TBYC.

In Jan / Feb each year the club calendar is produced and members are invited to choose their race duties for the coming season which is normally April to the following March. The dutyman calendar is then published populated with all duty holders names and an email is sent out to notify each member of their duties.

Duty Management

DutyMan can be accessed via the link on the website and duty-holders can access the full facilities by logging in with their name and password or just entering their email address which will send a link allowing you to log in without a password.

Duty-holders are advised to set up a 'favourite' or 'bookmark' on their computer, tablet or phone, with their password embedded, for quick and easy access to DutyMan.

DutyMan has good help and guidance tabs and links, and most actions in DutyMan can be done by the click of a mouse or the tap of a tablet.

DutyMan emails reminders to all duty-holders 10 Days and 3 days prior to each event.

2023 Duty Allocation

After the DutyMan calendar is published with allocated duties during March DutyMan will then email all duty-holders with their allocated duties and dates.

Please access DutyMan immediately on receipt of your duty list and ‘confirm’ your duties under the ‘confirm your duties’ tab. A blue tick (✓) will appear against your duty.

Confirming your duties at that time will let the duty managers know that:

- You are able to access DutyMan;
- DutyMan has your correct email address; and
- You are aware of your 2023 season duties.

You can still swap your duties at a later date even though you have confirmed them.

Any members without email addresses will receive their duty listing by post.

If you do not have any duties allocated but want to be involved, please email dutyadmin@tbyc.org and the DutyMan admin will contact you.

DutyMan Facilities

Log in to DutyMan to:

- Request and facilitate swaps – ***‘Request a Duty Swap’ – select up to 20.***
- Volunteer for a vacant or a ‘swap wanted’ duty - ***click on  or  in ‘volunteer for a duty’***
- Register any swaps which you have independently arranged with another member - ***request the duty swap and the other person accepts it by a ‘click’ in the email from DutyMan.***
- Register any replacement which you have independently arranged with another member -- ***click on the left of your duty and check the ‘swap wanted’ box. The other person ‘volunteers’ to take it by clicking on your  in ‘volunteer’ tab.***
- Update your contact details – ***in ‘Profile’. Input mobile numbers please.***
- Access the phone and email details of all duty-holders – ***in ‘Directory’.***
- Download the full racing programme and your duties to your electronic diary – ***‘Smartphones’ tab***

Duty Swapping

It is the duty-holder’s responsibility to seek a swap or a replacement if unable to undertake an allocated duty.

Please use DutyMan to facilitate or confirm swaps.

DutyMan communicates by email. Requested swaps can be accepted or rejected by the click of a mouse in an email from DutyMan. All changes undertaken in DutyMan are automatically confirmed by email and the roster updated.

A duty can only be changed in DutyMan by another member agreeing to ‘swap’ it or ‘volunteering’ to do it - i.e. offer and acceptance.

Duty Swapping - continued

The Dutyman Administrator can change any duty or member details.

Please agree to a swap, if at all possible, if you receive a request via Dutyman.

Please always respond to an email request for a swap from DutyMan – **it's ok to say no** – It only takes the click of the mouse.

If you have tried hard, but been unable to find a swap or replacement, please contact the TBYC DutyMan Administrator. Not at the last minute please.

Duty Procedures

Duty holders should meet the Duty Officer at the top of the slipway **one and a quarter hours before the start** of the first race. **RIB crews please meet adjacent to the clubhouse one and a half hours before the start.**

Briefing shall be undertaken, and support boats launched and crewed in time for the Race Officer to be ferried to the Committee Boat and Sandhopper crews taken to their boats.

Late arrivals cause significant difficulties for the Duty Officer and may delay racing. Unless you have discussed and agreed it the Duty Officer beforehand. **Please ensure that you turn up on time.**

Support Boat Guidelines and Race Officer Guidance are available on the TBYC website. Please read these documents before each duty as they may have changed.

Post Race 'Club' RIB recovery

The club RIBs may start to be recovered any time after the last dinghy has crossed the finishing line of the final race.

Sailing members' assistance to recover the RIBs onto the trailers on the slipway will be required after every race. Please help the RIB crews.

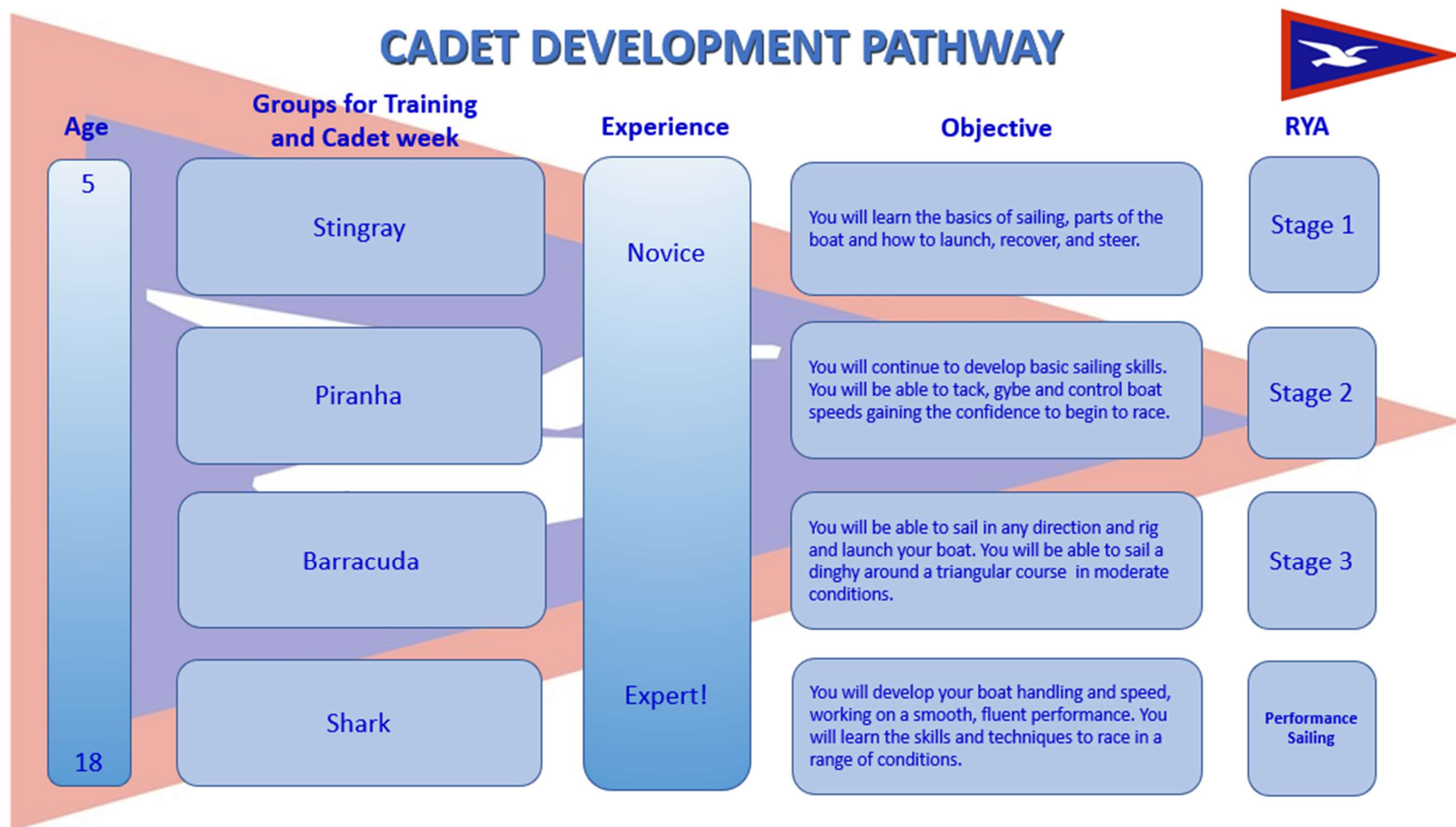

Stingrays - Oppie Beach Club

An opportunity for our youngest sailors to sail our club's Optimists. A parent will need to attend and participate with the child and help with rigging/ launching/recovering boats (no experience required). You will learn some of the basics of sailing, parts of the boat and how to launch, recover, and steer. There'll be some dry sailing (on the green) with most of the session spent on the water. The aim is to keep things fun, build confidence on the water and learn the basics.

Piranha group

For cadets aged 9 - 13 approximately who have tried sailing before and want to improve their skills. You will continue to develop basic sailing skills. You will be able to tack, gybe and control boat speeds gaining the confidence to begin to race. The group will have some adventures while also trying some racing

Barracuda group

This group is aimed at senior school aged cadets who are intermediate sailors who can sail a set course. Cadets will be able to sail in any direction and rig and launch their boat. Cadets will be able to sail a dinghy around a triangular course in moderate conditions. Cadets will enjoy racing and want to develop their skills. Ideally cadets should own or have access to their own boat

Shark group

For the competent and more experienced cadets ages 13 – 18 (Year 13) ideally with access to their own boat, the shark group will develop boat handling and speed, working on a smooth, fluent performance. Cadets will learn the skills and techniques to race in a range of conditions that can be transfer and used in main club racing

Mini Races

Cadet Sailing - Continued

Safety, parental responsibility, volunteering

Cadet sailing needs to be fun and safe. Careful risk assessment will be done to make sure that we have the sufficient resources for safety cover appropriate for the conditions. This includes safety boats and experienced safety crew. There will be days when it will not be safe to sail. This decision is the responsibility of the lead coach of the session. Flag officers and other experienced sailors of the club will support and help our coaches to make the right decisions. Every effort will be made to make sensible and timely decisions to help families to plan their weekend. The lead coach will advise parents - young or less experienced sailors may be encouraged to reef or discouraged from sailing in marginal conditions.

Parents/guardians/carers always take the ultimate responsibility for their child/children and any other child left in their care, even when the child is participating in activities being run by a club instructor/volunteers as per the Parent's charter please ensure you are familiar with this and other safeguarding policies. All sailors, coaches and safety crew on the water need to wear buoyancy aids. We need volunteers to support these sessions: parents and helpers will help on the beach to launch and safely recover boats. Boat setup needs checking before launching. Coaching and support boats will need experienced and PB2 qualified helms as well as crew. We encourage helpers to dress for sailing, it is often necessary to get wet when helping sailors in difficulties. Parents with little or no experience will also be strongly encouraged to get involved, your help is invaluable as support crew.

For planning and safety booking in advance will be requested for these sessions (sailors and safety volunteers), which will be advertised on the website, WhatsApp group and Facebook. We may not be able to take all keen sailors on the water if resources are not satisfactory. Every effort will be made to support young sailors, this could involve splitting sailors into two groups and then get the second group sailing after the first group finished. It is so much more convenient to meet these decisions and plan ahead.

Parents who volunteer to support cadet sailing will be recognised and valued by the club. We will keep a record of volunteer duties done. If you are given a club race duty and you wish to support your child's sailing instead, please, plan ahead and request a swap on dutyman. Please, do not hesitate to approach Andras, or other club officials to request help, do not leave it to the last minute. Cadet sailing is at the heart of our club, we are here to enjoy sailing, support families and have fun safely.
