

The Start Sailing Scheme

The Thorpe Bay Yacht Club Start Salling scheme makes learning to sail a fun and educational process. The syllabus is clearly defined and presented in three separate log books that are used to record and recognise the achievements of the participants' progress through each of the stages.

The club uses a purpose designed scheme more suitable for estuary sailing which is open to all members of any age who wish to learn the essential skills of tidal sailing and seamanship in a controlled and safe manner.

The aim is to encourage more of the youth of the club as well as parents to enjoy sailing and ultimately to be more involved in the club sailing programme. Parental support and encouragement is essential for the younger sailors.

All participants learn at their own pace in small groups using practical teaching methods. Each section of the course will be signed off when the student can demonstrate a practical knowledge of the section whilst being taught.

The team of instructors are all club members and work on a voluntary basis.

A parent or recognised guardian must be on the beach at all times during beach/water tuition for those cadets taking part in the course.






