Each event attracted visiting sailors from around the region, and the feedback from competitors was overwhelmingly positive — reflecting the club's reputation for well managed racing and warm hospitality.

There have been many highlights this season, but I would like to remember just a few; Holly Cole representing Team GB at the Ilca 4 Worlds in LA, Sam Blaker was first U22 Youth in the Aero 6 Nationals, Chris Boshier winning the Contender French National Championships, Alex Farrell with Alex and Daisy winning the Albacore Eastern Championships and Alex Farrell and Steve Hopper winning the Sandhopper Nationals.

The link between training and club racing is growing stronger each year, with several cadets now regularly racing in the main fleets.
